On the 5th November, 1895, the Fifth Brigade under Major-General Oseko, in pursuit of the fugitive Chinese, arrived here. The Chinese, finding defence impossible, set fire to it and escaped. The fire which lasted three days, destroyed a third of the busiest parts of the town.
